First Quarter

Action Steps


Second Quarter

Third Quarter

Action Steps

- Review your child's first semester report card and take note of the first calculated grade point average (GPA).
- Review your child's GradTrack report in the M-DCPS Parent Portal to monitor your child's progress toward graduation and college admissions requirements.
- Start discussing potential courses for the following year based on rigor, interests and State University requirements (including the required two years of a foreign language).
- Encourage your child to consult with teachers and counselors when planning course selection.
- Assist your child in preparing for any AP/IB/AICE exams by having them attend school site tutoring, workshops, and AP Central for access to AP videos and other resources.
- Encourage your child's continued involvement in school and/or community projects.
- Assist your child in researching opportunities for academic growth through enrichment programs, community-based involvement, or internships for the summer.
- Encourage your child to continue building their Scoir profile as the year progresses.
- Assist your child in the beginning stages of building a college list that mirrors their interests.
- Attend the Miami National College Fair with your child to engage with a variety of national and international institutions.

Action Steps
